• **2:30 p.m.** Families will enjoy Child Care Awareness Day, which will take place all afternoon at the State House. Families will gather in the Bell Room at the State House, which will be transformed into a pop-up early learning classroom, donated by Kaplan Early Learning.

Families will also meet with Rhode Island state legislators and elected officials to share their story.

Advocacy Focus for Strolling Thunder Rhode Island 2019 – funding for child care, State Pre-K, and family home visiting; improvements to the state's paid Family leave program

This year's Strolling Thunder Rhode Island is focusing on four key policy areas to help families with young children: high quality child care, pre-k, family home visiting, and paid family leave. We urge the General Assembly to increase funding for the Child Care Assistance Program to bring rates up to the federal benchmark for quality, to sustain and expand our high-quality Pre-K program, to invest state funds to sustain proven family home visiting models, and to make important changes to our state's Paid Family Leave program to enable families to take recommended leaves to care for babies.

Many Rhode Island families with babies and young children rely on these state-funded and managed programs that build a strong foundation for lifetime success.

About the national Think Babies™ campaign

Strolling Thunder™ is the flagship advocacy event of the Think Babies™ campaign, part of a national campaign designed to bring attention to the many issues that affect what babies and families need to thrive. Key campaign priorities include: quality, affordable child care; time for parents to bond with their babies; healthy emotional development; and strong physical health and nutrition. Our goal is to bring statewide attention to what babies — and families — need to thrive.

Areas of focus for *Think Babies* campaigns include:

- Increasing access to affordable, quality child care for infants and toddlers;
- Ensuring access to paid family leave policies;
- Increasing access to infant and early childhood mental health services;
- Ensuring access to voluntary, evidence-based home visiting for families with infants and toddlers; and
- Increasing access to child and family screenings, supports and linkages to needed services.
- Increasing access to healthy nutrition and obesity prevention initiatives for infants and toddlers.
