


Children With Health Insurance United States & Rhode Island





RIte Care Works for Pregnant Women



93% pregnant women received timely prenatal care in 2016.

Rates of delayed prenatal care are lower among women with RIte Care coverage than those who are uninsured.








Key Affordable Care Act (ACA) Provisions

- Pre-existing condition protections
- Essential Health Benefits for pregnant women and children (vision and dental)
- Coverage until age 26 on parents' plan
- Medicaid coverage for former foster youth up to age 26
- Annual and lifetime limits prohibited
- Medicaid Expansion
- HealthSource RI

And more....

Threats to ACA Remain



Elimination of Cost Sharing Reduction (CSR) Payments

- On October 12, CSR payments ended. As a result, RI premiums for 2018 silver level plans increased 18%-20%.
- In 2017, 56% (16,476) of HealthSource RI customers enrolled in plans with CSRs.

- Medicaid Expansion



Children's Health Insurance Program (CHIP)



- CHIP was enacted in 1997.
- Today, CHIP provides health coverage to 9 million children in the U.S., including 27,000 Rhode Island children.
- Rhode Island operates a blended Medicaid/CHIP program (Rite Care).
- The federal match for CHIP in RI is 88%.
- Federal funding lapsed 37 days ago.

Our Collective Charge



- Urgently advocate for a 5-year reauthorization of CHIP and continued strong support for the ACA at the federal level.
- Continue our **strong state leadership and advocacy** on health coverage.
- Maintain our commitment to connecting families to comprehensive and affordable coverage.
- Cover all kids
 - •98% of Rhode Island kids are covered
 - 100% is within our reach
